

SBTi FAQs

What if I've already set targets, they're just not science-based targets?

While already having targets in place is a great start, we are asking suppliers to commit to science-based targets specifically to ensure all our efforts are being measured and working towards the same goal.

What happens if I am not committed? Will you stop doing business with my company or will we lose volume?

We are asking suppliers to share their plans because Sysco agreed to do so when we committed to SBTi. Although we hope you and other suppliers also commit to set science-based targets, we are not requiring suppliers to do so at this time.

How do I set a target and how long does it take?

Companies first sign a commitment letter, after which they have 24 months to create an emissions baseline and develop and submit their science-based reduction targets. Once validated by SBTi, companies can communicate their target.

Who else has done this already? Where can I learn more?

Over 1,300 companies globally have committed and set Science Based Targets, including Tyson, McCain, Walmart, Target, Disney, etc. You can learn more at the SBTi website.

What is the timeline for making SBTi commitments?

We are not recommending any deadlines to suppliers for making their SBTi commitments. However, we appreciate suppliers proactively working towards making SBTi commitments.

Sysco is currently building resources and partnerships to help support our suppliers along this journey. We welcome feedback from you on the support you need, so please let us know if you have a specific need or requirement in mind.
